Amount: The award is up to a maximum of \$12,500 for the Associate's degree and up to \$25,000 for the bachelor's degree (must attend a partner school, such as NOVA). **This is a scholarship for students who have DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) or TPS (Temporary Protected Status) only.**
